1:30 p.m.: Former Arkansas Gov. **Mike Huckabee** will campaign at Cliffs Valley Club House in Travelers Rest.

1:30 p.m.: **Romney** will campaign in Charleston.

2:30 p.m.: **Huckabee** will campaign at North Greenville University in Tigerville.

4:30 p.m.: **Romney** will campaign at Francis Marion University in Florence.

7:30 p.m.: **Huckabee** will campaign at The Citadel in Charleston.

7:30 p.m.: **Romney** will campaign at the University of South Carolina.

Edwards will attend MLK rally. Former U.S. Sen. John Edwards, a Democratic presidential candidate, announced Tuesday he would attend the King Day at the Dome rally sponsored by the South Carolina NAACP. U.S. Sens. Hillary Clinton and Barack Obama also will participate.

Family group mailing DVD about candidates. The Palmetto Family Council has produced a DVD with the candidates for president speaking on social issues. The conservative group said it produced the DVD voter guide to help voters make a decision before the state's presidential primaries begin Saturday. The DVD is being mailed to 97,000 South Carolina voters.

Edwards' parents hit campaign trail. U.S. Sen. John Edwards' parents, Bobbie and Wallace Edwards, will kick off a four-day bus tour aboard Edwards' "Main Street Express" bus.

Pastor to speak on Paul's behalf. Pastor Chuck Baldwin of Crossroad Baptist Church in Pensacola, Fla., will speak on behalf of Republican presidential hopeful Ron Paul from 10:30 a.m. to noon Thursday in the Blue Room at the State Museum in Columbia.
